From the Executive Director

Recently, I visited the apartment complex where I first started serving on Casino Road. My visit brought to mind all the good and bad times I experienced there. I still remember the day I wanted to quit after a kid decided to lock me in a garage. This youngster in 3rd grade led the other older children in a rebellion against me. He called me a few choice words, grabbed the lock, told the other children, "let's leave," and then closed the garage leaving his younger brother and me in the garage. After I got out, I told God I was done with



'these' kids. I thought to myself, "what impact am I having on them during the 10 hours a week I spend with them?". I allowed myself to doubt the **power** of relationships.

Recently, I had the chance to talk with former and current CRKM participants. Matt, a former participant, is now an apartment manager on Casino Road. Matt and his two younger brothers attended homework club at the apartments 13 years ago. He and I would spend hours talking about his dream of being an apartment manager. We'd pray together, go on field trips and spend time at my house. I would encourage him to focus on his education to reach his dream. Matt struggled in school, but didn't quit and I was able to see him graduate. Now he's managing an apartment building! Praise the LORD. (By the way: Matt's younger brother is the one who locked me in the garage.)

A current participant, Justin (name changed), I've known for 10 years. We met when I mentored his older brother. At club we found out Justin struggled with math. Each week volunteers worked diligently with him on his math facts. A few weeks ago, at school, Justin ran up to me to share he passed the math section of the MAP test. The smile on his face went from ear to ear. I was so proud of him and the volunteers who spent time working with him.

These stories remind me of how much impact our relationships (time and care) make in the lives of children. The fruit of our labor may not show in a week, month, year or three years. But over time, as we continue to build relationships, we will see growth.

I'm so grateful I didn't give up on these kids back in 2000. I would have never seen the great things God is doing in their lives.
